In recognition of the fact that we remain at war this Christmas, the **Downtown Walla Walla Foundation** dedicated the Community Christmas Tree as a memorial to soldiers lost in Iraq and their families. The Foundation has created individual ornaments recognizing each soldier from Washington State who has been killed in Iraq and identifying their local hometown. They plan to send a Christmas card to the soldier's loved ones with a photograph of the tree, letting them know that our community is thinking of them this season.

The tree was donated by **Klicker's Berries & Antiques** and placed next to the Downtown flagpole with Old Glory flying over head along with the POW/MIA flag. The 15' tree was transported to town by **Elsom Roofing Company** and **Voth Construction** furnished the carpenters to build the stand. Lot's of help was provided by **Land Title of Walla Walla and Darrrah's Decorating center.**

Bill and Maureen Vollendorf created the beautiful yellow ribbons in recognition of the troops.

A Different Christmas Poem

Then he bent and he carefully pulled from his bag, The red, white, and blue... an American flag. I can live through the cold and the being alone, Away from my family, my house and my home. I can stand at my post through the rain and the sleet, I can sleep in a foxhole with little to eat. I can carry the weight of killing another, Or lay down my life with my sister and brother... Who stand at the front against any and all, To ensure for all time that this flag will not fall." "So go back inside," he said, "harbor no fright, Your family is waiting and I'll be all right." "But isn't there something I can do, at the least, "Give you money," I asked, "or prepare you a feast? It seems all too little for all that you've done, For being away from your wife and your son." Then his eye welled a tear that held no regret, "Just tell us you love us, and never forget. To fight for our rights back at home while we're gone, To stand your own watch, no matter how long. For when we come home, either standing or dead, To know you remember we fought and we bled. Is payment enough, and with that we will trust, That we mattered to you as you mattered to us."

PLEASE, would you do me the kind favor of sending this to as many people as you can? Christmas will be coming soon and some credit is due to our U.S service men and women for our being able to celebrate these festivities. Lets try in this small way to pay a tiny bit of what we owe. To be eligible for membership, you must have served in the U.S. Armed Forces, including the National Guard and Reserves, anytime after Sept. 15, 1940.

Additionally, unless still serving, your discharge must have been under honorable conditions. If you served as an American citizen in the armed forces of an allied nation, under honorable conditions, between Sept. 15, 940 and May 8, 1975, you are also eligible, as are wartime members of the Merchant Marine. Proof of eligibility can take the form of a DD-214, an honorable discharge certificate or other appropriate document.
